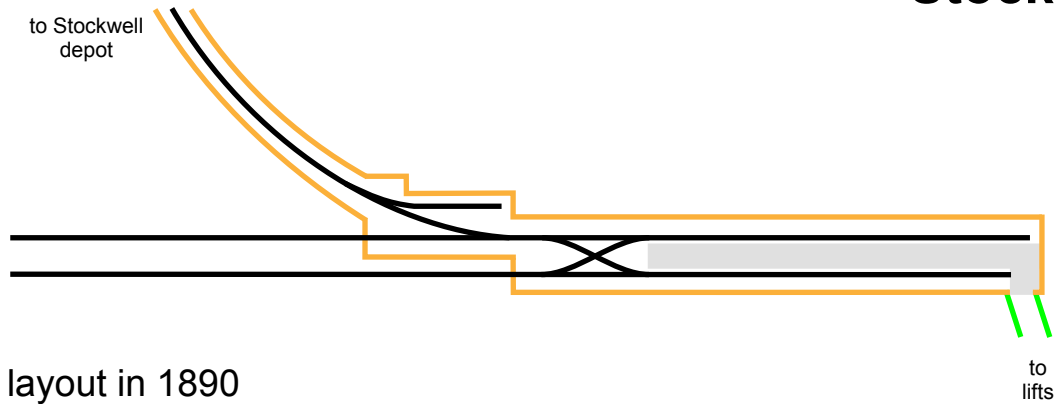
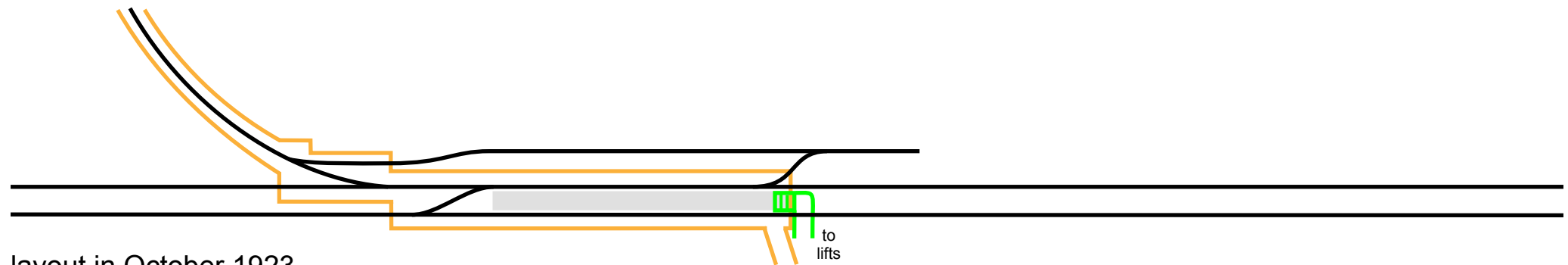


Stockwell



layout in 1890

Stockwell is a terminus station with an island platform
Access to the platforms is via the passage at the south end of the platform
The depot is generally used for maintenance and has a generating station
The cars and locos are stabled on the running line

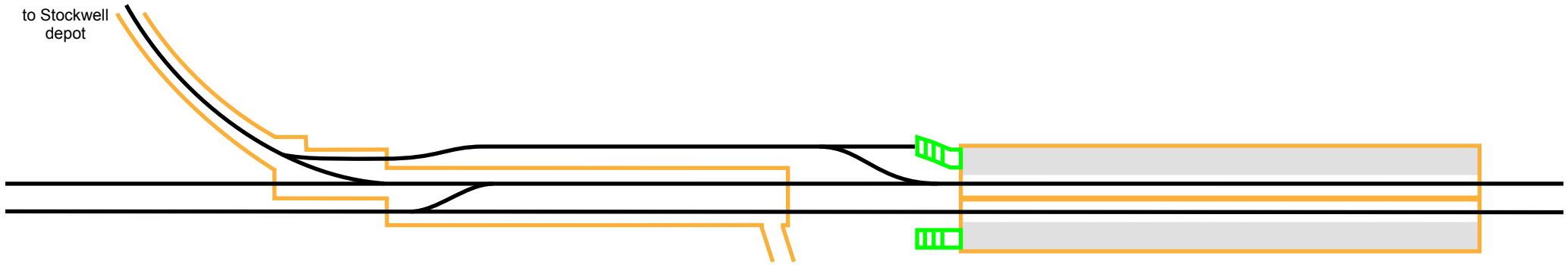


layout in October 1923

The terminus was extended to Clapham Common in 1900
As a consequence, access to the platforms is now via a set of stairs at the south end of the platform
An additional stabling siding / loop has been added
Work has already started on widening the C&SLRly tunnels and extending the platforms

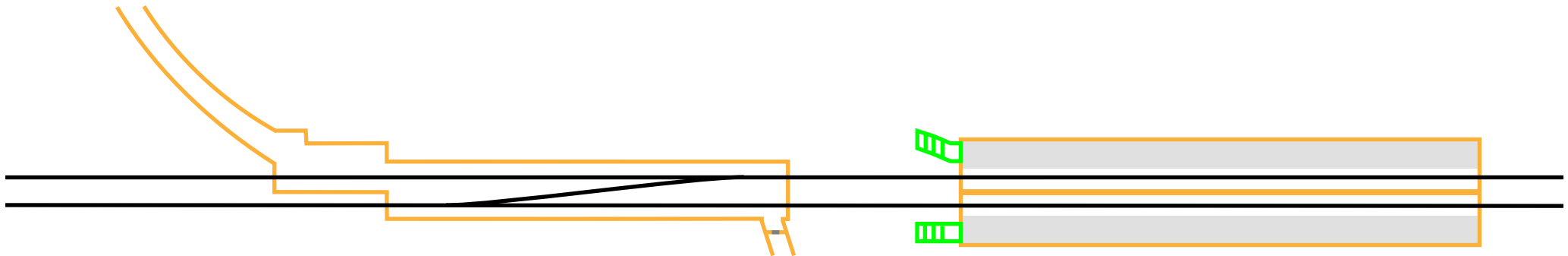

layout in November 1924

The line has just been re-opened and extended to Morden
A new platform has been built south of the old station



layout today

A new, faster, crossover has been installed (1975) in the old platform area
Advantage has been taken of the space available to make the crossover longer, thus reducing the severity of the curve when crossing from one line to the other
